Best Practice III

Title

Implementation of daily class test hour for slow learners with extra learning needs to improve their learning outcomes

Objectives

- To aid students identified as slow learners to improve their learning outcomes and performance in CIE (Continuous Internal Evaluation) and ESE (End Semester Examination)
- To improve institute's pass percentage among affiliating university's non-autonomous affiliated colleges

The Context

- The end semester examinations (ESE) performance of students is seriously viewed both by enrolled students and their parents. Students differ in their learning the common aspect being the pace at which they learn.
- Slow learners need extra attention, effort and time both from the students and the faculty members
- Slow learners contribute to the decline in pass percentage of the institute which needs to be addressed
- Bringing slow learners to speed with the other learners builds their capacity, and confidence

The Practice

- The institute identified the first period of every day time table as test hour for slow learners
- The topics for the test were informed to students a day prior to the test
- The test papers were valued and the answer scripts with marks were given back to students the next day.
- The students who did not pass the test were given extra course inputs, and foundational concepts to strengthen their comprehension of the topics of the test.
- The students who did not pass in the test were asked to give a re-test on the 3rd day from the day of the original test

- The practice of giving tests everyday enabled students to revise their lessons everyday which resulted in improving their performance in internal tests, and end semester examinations.
- The practice improved the learning capacity and confidence

Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- Additional attention, effort, and time required
- The practice requires close monitoring, encouragement by class advisors, subject handling faculty to give the tests, re-tests everyday
- Additional coaching by faculty members required students, faculty members to stay back after normal working hours in some instances and necessitated arrangements for extra college buses for transportation.

Title

Organize Product of Products exhibitions and Science Day exhibitions to showcase student innovations, projects, and inventions to encourage an entrepreneurial attitude among students

Objectives

- To foster entrepreneurial thinking, creativity and innovation by engaging students in producing and showcasing their product innovations, projects and inventions
- To inculcate entrepreneurial mindset and develop a sense of getting prepared to be an entrepreneur in the medium term or long-term

The Context

- The prescribed curriculum provides for limited development of entrepreneurial attitude through fabrication and showcasing of student innovation, projects, and inventions
- There is a need to make the students present their ideas in a tangible form to engage all the elements of their cognition
- The student's academic performance should be supported by development of skills in developing prototypes, kits that demonstrate application of concepts, tools learnt
- India's industrial and educational policies have progressively emphasized the need for India's youth to actively engage in starting ventures of their own with incubator support of selected higher education institutions

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The Practice

- Every year a Product of Products exhibition and Science Day exhibitions have been conducted involving the students of Kathir College of Engineering and school students from the Coimbatore Education District
